



The Drappier family has been producing Champagne since 1808. This historic and pioneering house was instrumental in reintroducing Pinot Noir to the Aube post phylloxera and it continues to work at the cutting edge of Champagne production. Provenance, excellence and distinctive style are the mantras, both in the vineyard, which are increasingly farmed according to organic principles, and in the cellar, where minimal use of sulphur is the rule and the wines remain unfiltered. In 2016, Drappier became the first 'carbon neutral' Champagne house.

Champagne

- 1 Champagne Drappier 1er Cru NV Brut** **125ml £13.50 Bottle £78.00**
60% Pinot Noir, 30% Chardonnay, 10% Pinot Meunier
The grapes come only from Grand Cru and Premier Cru vineyards. Very low in sulphur. Elegant and fresh on the nose. Firm and intense, with pear, spices, vanilla and a hint of acacia honey. Toasty bread, long on the palate with a light hazelnut aftertaste.

- 2 Champagne Drappier Brut Rosé NV** **125ml £14.50 Bottle £85.00**
100% Pinot Noir
A unique Champagne Rosé made using the saignée method and with very low sulphur. Well structured, with exemplary purity of red fruits. Warm and satiny, lightly spiced with balanced hints of stoned fruits thanks to a lovely freshness in the finish.

- 3 Champagne Drappier Grande Sendrée 2010** **Bottle £150.00**
92% Pinot Noir, 8% Chardonnay
Impressively rich and savoury, Drappier's flagship wine shows complex, mature notes of dried fruit, toast and wax, alongside vivid stone fruit and citrus flavours. The palate is graceful despite its underlying power and finishes extremely long.

Sparkling Wine

- 4 Prosecco Extra Dry, Terra Serena 1881, Treviso, Italy** **Bottle £38.00**
Bright straw yellow with greenish reflex. Lively perlage, and intense scents of white flowers and golden apple. Good intensity, fresh, elegant and soft at taste, pleasantly sugary.

- 5 No. 1 Family Estate Rosé, Marlborough, New Zealand, NV** **125ml £10.95 Bottle £62.00**
100% Pinot Noir. A delicate salmon-pink with a mass of tiny bubbles, the wine offers a seamless balance of subtle cherry and almond hints combined with a fresh acidity. Dry, yet fresh and elegant, this wine leaves a lasting impression of opulence and splendour.

- 6 Franciacorta, Marchese Antinori Cuvée Royale NV** **125ml £11.95 Bottle £70.00**
78% Chardonnay, 12% Pinot Noir. 10% Pinot Blanc. A light yellow in colour with a creamy bubbling and an elegant and persistent sparkle. The aromas recall white peaches, bread crusts, and yeast. The notable balance and liveliness are typical of a well-made Brut.

The Wine List

Dry Whites - light, easy drinking

- 1 **Marsanne/Vermentino Joie de Vigne, Languedoc-Roussillon, France 2020** **£26.00**
Aromas of white fruits (peach, citrus, grapefruit) and a hint of peony lead to a crisp, fruity palate which is both easy to drink and refreshing.
- 2 **Gavi di Gavi, 'Rovereto'. Il Poggio, Italy 2020** **£38.00**
100% Cortese from a small, naturally-minded producer with an all-female team in the Rovereto hills. This is rich and rounded Gavi di Gavi, even when young due to undergoing malolactic fermentation. Articulated limestone and lemon notes backed with hints of sage and apple and a lovely crunchy acidity.
- 3 **Grüner Veltliner, Gruber Röschitz, Weinveiertel, Austria 2020** **£43.00**
An exciting family winery, run by 3 siblings. Fruit is sourced from their 4 different vineyards with differing soil types. Bursting with tangy vibrant unoaked plump green fruits with hints of white pepper and peach. Organic and vegan.
- 4 **Pinot Grigio 'Fireman's Line' Schiopetto, Friuli, Italy 2019** **£46.00**
Mario Schiopetto was regarded as the father of modern Italian white wine, his Friuli winery today making some of Italy's finest. This floral, juicy pinot grigio from younger vines around 20 years old is full of ripe pear, fennel, almond and mineral notes. Vegan.
- 5 **Chablis, Hamelin, Burgundy, France 2018** **£58.00**
Soft rounded Chablis, smooth texture cut through with steely acidity. Crisp on the palate while displaying good depth of flavour, and a long, dynamic finish.
- 6 **Sancerre, Domaine La Barbotaine, Loire, France 2020** **125ml** **£12.50** **£65.00**
Crisp, flavoursome Sancerre which offers elderflower and boxwood aromas. The palate shows juicy citrus fruit alongside the trademark elegance and minerality of the appellation. Vegan.
- 7 **Pinot Gris, Elk Cove, Willamette Valley, Oregon USA 2017** **125ml** **£13.95** **£68.00**
Elk Cove are one of Oregon's oldest and most respected wineries, famed for producing some of the top Pinot Gris in the region. Plump, soft, oily and dry. Ripe melon, spiced pear and apricot blossom notes.
- 8 **Arinto/Verdelho, Branco Vulcanico, Azores Wine Company, Açores, Portugal 2018** **125ml** **£15.95** **£75.00**
A dry white blend of Arinto and Verdelho planted on extraordinary, volcanic coastal vineyards in the Azores. Taut and fresh with crisp, intense saline and citrus flavours. Floral notes of guava followed by hints of grapefruit rind and oyster-shell. A medium-bodied round palate, but with impressive focus and intensity; long and precise.



Off Dry Whites - aromatic, riper fruit, dry

- 9 **Viognier, Revelation, Badet Clément, Languedoc-Roussillon, France 2020** **£34.00**
Bursting with typical flavours of apricot and peach alongside elegant floral notes. The palate is round, with a refreshing acidity and a perfectly balanced finish.
- 10 **Sauvignon Blanc, Blackenbrook, Nelson, New Zealand 2020** **£40.00**
Highly aromatic and focused, vibrantly fruity with pure passionfruit and gooseberry flavours supported by an interwoven thread of acidity. Vegan.
- 11 **Sauvignon/Sauvignon Gris/Sémillon, Château Montfollet Le Valentin, Bordeaux. France 2020** **£45.00**
Aromas of ripe grapefruit and pineapple leap out of the glass accented by hints of vanilla. Ripe and juicy, packed with vibrant fruit, this dry white has an appealing, almost creamy texture before finishing fresh and dry. Vegan.
- 12 **Gewurztraminer, Terres de Gres, Robert Roth, Alsace, France 2019** **£49.00**
Hedonistic nose of lychee, spiced peach, ginger, charcuterie. A slightly earthy finish, medium-weight and versatile - not too sweet. 4th generation winemaker, young Victor Roth has recently taken over the winemaking and is a real talent to watch.
- 13 **Riesling Kabinett Annaberg, Werner, Mosel, Germany 2018** **£52.00**
A classic Mosel Riesling with a fresh lemony fragrance and complex minerality and stone fruits on the palate as acidity and sweetness exist in perfect harmony.
- 14 **Riesling, Head, Eden Valley, Barossa, Australia 2018** **£56.00**
A superb dry Riesling from some of the oldest vines in the region. Linear, tangy with crisp focused lime, orange blossom, developing notes of kerosene and added complexity. Vegan.
- 15 **Chenin Blanc, Vouvray Sec Cuvee Amedee, Phillippe Brisebarre, Loire Valley, France 2006** **125ml  £13.95 £68.00**
A white of great complexity with notes of ripe apple, a touch of quince and a delicate nutty finish. A medium-bodied dry white of great character and depth. Vegan.
- 16 **Montagny 1er Cru, Henri de Villamont, Burgundy, France 2018** **£75.00**
Richly vibrant white Burgundy, offering characteristic aromas of red apple and grilled nuts, and a creamy texture on the palate cut with some citrus freshness. Lovely balance and length complete this fine expression of the Henri de Villamont style.



Orange Wine

- 25 **Kisi, Dugladze, Kakheti, Georgia 2017** **£55.00**

Georgia, lying on the crossroads of Europe and Asia is sometimes referred to as "The Cradle of Wine" due to its 8000-year-old winemaking history. Many of the ancient techniques are still in use today. Historically wines were fermented with skins, stems and all in giant clay jars called Qvevri, often buried in soil, where they remained for several months or even years in extreme cases. This lends the white wines a unique textural element; amber-hued with the breadth and depth of a red wine including an appealing tannin component, while the process reduces the need for sulphur additions. These wines have proved the inspiration behind today's burgeoning orange wine movement.

Perfumed with aromas of dried mango, honeydew melon and orange rind, this has a full bodied yet silky and elegant palate finishing dry with supple elegant tannins. A top-quality example of the genre.

Rosé Wine

- 26 **Rioja Rosé, Conde Valdemar, Spain 2020** **£32.00**

Clear, pale salmon colour, with delicate raspberry fruit and the elegant herbal finish of Garnacha, overlaid with floral notes from the Mazuelo.

- 27 **Côtes de Provence Rosé Carte Noire, Les Maitres Vignerons de St Tropez, Provence, France 2020** **£42.00**

Very refined dry rosé, with an attractive floral aroma, redcurrant fruit, and excellent length in the mouth.

- 28 **Cabernet Franc/Syrah, Sunset Rose, Chateau Ksara, Lebanon 2019** **£50.00**

Chateau Ksara is Lebanon's largest and oldest commercial winery, established by Jesuit monks in 1857. Their Sunset Rose is a crisp wine that works perfectly as an aperitif or with Mediterranean cuisine. Deeply coloured with gorgeous aromas of strawberries and spice, this is juicy and lively on the palate with summer berries and cream.

Sake – Kanpai Brewery, Peckham, South-East London, UK

Founders Tom and Lucy Wilson were so inspired by what they saw and tasted in Japan that a few years ago they began home-brewing Sake with great success. Their rice is source from both California and Japan and traditional Japanese yeasts and Koji are used. Their sakes have already begun to win awards and national recognition with presence in Michelin starred restaurants. The quality more than matches that of their Japanese counterparts.

- 29 **Wasabi Leaf & Apple Sparkling Sake (330ml)** **£ 8.50**

Junmai Sake infused with Dorset wasabi and Herefordshire cider apple. Medium-dry, honeyed tangy apple, with a hint of herb and umami

- 30 **Kumo Tokubetsu Junmai Nigori** 100ml Glass **£10.95** 375ml Bottle: **£45.00**

70% milled super-premium Japanese Gohyakumangoku rice. This deliberately contains rice sediment, so we shake before using. Delicious; off-dry with a soft round texture and great depth of flavour including complex tropical fruit and banana notes.



Light-bodied Reds – fruity, softer tannins

- 31 **Grenache/Pinot Noir, Joie de Vigne, Languedoc-Roussillon, France 2020** **£26.00**
Inviting aromas of red fruits are lifted by pepper and cinnamon. The palate is smooth and spicy, finishing on more berry fruit.
- 32 **Brouilly ‘Terre de Combatiey’ Manoir du Carra, Beaujolais, France 2019** **£38.00**
From 50-year-old Gamay vines grown on granite soils, this is a seductively perfumed light-medium bodied red with supple pomegranate, floral and red cherry fruits.
- 33 **Pinot Nero, Sandro de Bruno Rosso Fumo, Veneto, Italy 2017** **£48.00**
Ruby red, bright and consistent. On the nose a beautiful bouquet of fresh red fruit: raspberry, wild strawberry, marasca cherry, and cranberry; then floral of rosehip and violet. Spicy hints of black pepper in large grains and cloves. Delicate tannins with juicy softness, savoury and bitter notes.
- 34 **Barbera/Nebbiolo, ‘The Truffle Hound’, Unico Zelo, Clare Valley, Australia 2019** **£52.00**
The wine pairs ripe fruit flavours with the crisp acidity that one would expect from these northern Italian varieties. Upfront blackberry and bitter cherry fruit give way to notes of dried herbs and anise. The finish is dry and persistent. Vegan.
- 35 **Pinot Noir, Sancerre, Berthier, Loire, France 2018** **£62.00**
A family domaine now run by 2 young brothers Clément and Florian. This cool climate Pinot Noir from Burgundian clay-limestone soils, undergoes a warm fermentation for maximum colour and flavour extraction. Energetic, layered Pinot Noir showing pomegranate, raspberries with underlying earth and a peppery finish.
- 36 **Tinto Vulcânico, The Azores Wine Company, Açores, Portugal 2018** **£68.00**
The windswept archipelago of the Azores in the mid-Atlantic is one of the world’s most unique wine regions, recognised by Unesco. A delicious blend of around a dozen local and international grape varieties, grown in unique, walled volcanic vineyards in the mid-Atlantic. Enticing and exotic on the nose with rosehip, rhubarb, raspberry and iodine. A definitive salty mineral character finishes on the vibrant palate.
- 37 **Pinot Noir, Fess Parker, Santa Rita Hills, California, USA 2017** 125ml  **£18.25** **£85.00**
An outstanding Pinot from the hills just inland from the Pacific Ocean. Full of raspberry liqueur, stewed plum, cinnamon and dark spices. Vegan.



Medium-bodied Reds

- 38 **Carignan/Grenache, Celler Masroig Rojalet Seleccio, Montsant, Spain 2018** **£36.00**
Medium-full with perfumed aromas of mulberry, blueberry and a hint of well-handled vanilla and coffee oak. Soft, supple and approachable, delivering delicious, lush early-drinking pleasure. Vegan.
- 39 **Syrah, 'Stone Paddock', Paritua, Hawkes Bay, New Zealand 2019** **£46.00**
From rising star of the region Paritua (meaning the meandering stream above the ancient river). This Syrah shows ripe blueberry and violets with savoury notes of exotic spice and clove. The palate has flavours of plum, five spice and clove with white pepper and cedar on the finish. Vegan.
- 40 **Sangiovese, Chianti Classico, Pèppoli, Villa Antinori, Toscana, Italy 2019** **£48.00**
Intense red fruit aromas are offset by delicate notes of vanilla and chocolate. Pleasantly lingering with a fresh, vibrant feel in the mouth.
- 41 **Cabernet Sauvignon, Powers, Washington State, United States 2018** **£50.00**
97% Cabernet Sauvignon, blended with a tiny touch of Carménère and Merlot. Savoury notes of fennel and sage are backed by deep aromas of blackberry, black raspberry, and cassis, notes of wet limestone and gravel.
- 42 **Crozes-Hermitage, Lauraent Habrard, Rhone, France 2018** **£62.00**
From an exciting dynamic thinking young winemaker. 100% organic Syrah fermented in concrete tanks and foot-trod daily using minimal sulphur during the winemaking process. Bottled unfiltered, to preserve texture and aromatics. Rich blackberry, black pepper and that textbook "animal" gamey character associated with good Crozes-Hermitage.
- 43 **Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Chateau de Manissy, Rhone Valley, France 2019** **£68.00**
A dense purple colour, with purplish hues. The nose is dominated by ripe fruit and cherry brandy and evolves into a fragrance of coffee and sweet oak. After a fine attack, quality tannins arise. The mouth is rich, flavourful, black currant liqueur, liquorice and coffee are expressed and remains.
- 44 **Chambolle-Musigny, Henri de Villamont, Burgundy, France 2016** **125ml** **£19.25** **£90.00**
A delightful, graceful Chambolle that combines succulent blueberry and redcurrant fruit with the appellation's typical scent of jasmine and incense. Medium-bodied, with a fluid, silky texture, this is an elegant classic.



Full-bodied, heavier Reds

- 45 **Obidos Tinto, Casa Das Gaieras, Lisboa, Portugal 2019** **£32.00**
35% Touriga Nacional, 35% Tinta Roriz, 30% Syrah from coastal vineyards. Packed with powerful dark cherry fruits with hints of liquorice and pepper. Rich, juicy and structured with fine tannin and acidity.
- 46 **'Friends Red' Pedroncelli, Sonoma County, California, USA 2016** **£38.00**
73% Merlot, 12% Syrah, 8% Zinfandel, 7% Sangiovese. Cassis and plum on the nose, vanilla and mocha aromas developing. Velvety palate, with soft tannins and great balance.
- 47 **Shiraz, Woodstock 'Deep Sands', McLaren Vale, Australia 2015** **£40.00**
A superbly rich, multi-layered expression of Shiraz from its South Australian heartland. Full of dark sweet forest fruits with hints of Christmas spice and seaweed on a lingering palate.
- 48 **Merlot, Montagne St Emilion, Château Montaguillon, Bordeaux, France 2018** **£50.00**
An expressive nose of roasted plums, dried herbs and fresh earthy notes leads to a full, plush palate typical of this very successful vintage.
- 49 **Cuvelier Los Andes Colección Malbec, Mendoza, Argentina 2018** **£55.00**
The origins of the Cuvelier family's wine exploits begin in Bordeaux in the early twentieth century with the purchase of Château le Crock in St. Estèphe in 1903. But, for many, they are best known for their ownership of Château Leoville Poyferré, which they bought in 1920. A lush texture, freshness, balance and just enough acidity. Its deep purple colour has stunning aromas of espresso, black cherry and raspberry.
- 50 **Mencia 'Tessin de la Campana', Bodegas Abad, Spain 2014** **125ml**  **£14.95** **£65.00**
From a high-altitude single vineyard of 100-year-old vines. Handpicked and then hand sorted. Wonderfully perfumed with aromas of blackberry and mulberry touched with hints of cracked black pepper and exotic spices. Lovely refined long tannins roll out on the complex, beautifully balanced finish. Vegan.
- 51 **Rioja Reserva, Castillo de Mendoza, Rioja, Spain 2010** **£76.00**
A new star of Rioja. From a great vintage, this is a deep, rich red with layers of blackberry, violet, soy, liquorice and vanilla notes with a creamy texture, ripe, fine tannins and a finish that goes on forever.
- 52 **Barolo 'Meriane', Paolo Manzone Piemonte, Italy 2015** **125ml**  **£18.95** **£95.00**
Single vineyard, perfumed notes of roses, maraschino cherry, damson and a touch of blackberry with gamey notes emerging with air. Ripe, fine tannins and poised with a balanced acidity.
- 53 **Château Batailley, Pauillac, Bordeaux, France 2015** **125ml**  **£21.50** **£115.00**
One of the oldest estates in Medoc, this is drinking superbly. A very typical Pauillac, showing firm cassis and cigar-box aromas, medium weight with a degree of power in the mouth, and a long savoury finish.



Full-bodied, heavier Reds continued...

- 54 **Grand Malbec, Cuvelier Los Andes, Mendoza, Argentina 2016** 125ml **£22.50** **£120.00**
Biodynamically farmed Malbec grapes are fermented in new French oak barrels in the Andes by a leading Bordeaux chateau. this is rich, powerful with dense. With dark blackberry, violet, liquorice, soy and espresso flavours and a long, long finish. Only 9,500 bottles produced. Vegan
- 55 **Ermitage 'Les Dionnieres', Ferraton, Rhone, France 2012** **£145.00**
Complex nose with aromas of violet flowers, small red berries, spices and liquorice. A full-bodied, long-lasting wine with great elegance. 94 points Wine Spectator.
- 56 **Tignanello, Villa Antinori Toscana IGT, Italy 2018** 125ml **£28.90** **£165.00**
An icon of Italian wines and the first ever 'Super Tuscan'. Predominately Sangiovese with Cabernet and Cabernet Franc making up the blend. Plum and cherries mingle with mint and liquorice, creating a vivid, harmonious balance from the first impression through to the long, savoury finish.

- 57 **Moscatel Naturalmente Dulce, Finca Antigua, Castilla-La Mancha, Spain 2019** Half Bottle: 375ml **£30.00**
 Glass: 125ml **£10.50**
A stunning mixture of concentration and freshness, tingling with orangey acidity and floral, grapey aromas, then direct, powerful and surprisingly sweet on the palate.
- 58 **Muscat Noir, Woodstock, McClaren Vale, Australia NV** Half Bottle: 375ml **£30.00**
 Glass: 125ml **£10.50**
A late-picked fortified wine that has aged in barrel for years before release, building sweet, nutty, raisined complexity along the way. Drink with blue cheese, chocolate or caramel desserts.
- 59 **Tokaji Late Harvest 'Pallas', Fuleky, Tokaj, Hungary 2016** Bottle: 375ml **£35.00**
 Glass: 125ml **£12.00**
A sweet, late-harvest blend of 50% Furmint, 40% Muskotály, 10% Hárslevelu. Floral notes of lychee and baked peach and an elegant refreshing sweetness that never overpowers.
- 60 **Sauternes, Château Haut-Mayne, Bordeaux, France 2018** Half Bottle: 375ml **£40.00**
 Glass: 125ml **£14.50**
The classic French dessert wine, a blend of late harvest botrytised Sauvignon and Semillon packed with ripe, honeyed tropical fruits overlaid with vanilla and hints of butterscotch.
- 61 **Vidal Ice Wine 'Golden Diamond', Changyu Liaoning, China 2015** Bottle: 500ml **£75.00**
 Glass: 100ml **£17.95**
A world-class ice wine of thrilling purity and intensity, offering aromas of pear, lychee and honey. The palate's lusciousness is balanced by a keen citrus edge, and the freshness of flavour carries through to a beautifully cleansing finish.
