



The Drappier family has been producing Champagne since **1808**. This historic and pioneering house was instrumental in reintroducing Pinot Noir to the Aube post phylloxera, and it continues to work at the cutting edge of Champagne production. Provenance, excellence and distinctive style are the mantras, both in the vineyard, which are increasingly farmed according to organic principles, and in the cellar, where minimal use of sulphur is the rule and the wines remain unfiltered. In **2016**, Drappier became the first 'carbon neutral' Champagne house.

Champagne

- 1 **Champagne Drappier 1er Cru NV Brut** **125ml** £13.95 **Bottle** £78.00
60% Pinot Noir, 30% Chardonnay, 10% Pinot Meunier
The grapes come only from Grand Cru and Premier Cru vineyards. Very low in sulphur. Elegant and fresh on the nose. Firm and intense, with pear, spices, vanilla and a hint of acacia honey. Toasty bread, long on the palate with a light hazelnut aftertaste.
- 2 **Champagne Drappier Brut Rosé NV** **125ml** £14.95 **Bottle** £85.00
100% Pinot Noir
A unique Champagne Rosé made using the saignée method and with very low sulphur. Well structured, with exemplary purity of red fruits. Warm and satiny, lightly spiced with balanced hints of stoned fruits thanks to a lovely freshness in the finish.
- 3 **Champagne Drappier Brut Nature Sans Soufre** **Bottle** £98.00
100% Pinot Noir
A thrilling champagne of real depth and energy, this sugar-free, sulphur-free blanc de noirs offers a rich nose of apple, pear and hazelnut, followed by a bone-dry palate full of refined lemon and mineral flavour.
- 4 **Champagne Drappier Grande Sendrée 2010** **Bottle** £150.00
92% Pinot Noir, 8% Chardonnay
Impressively rich and savoury, Drappier's flagship wine shows complex, mature notes of dried fruit, toast and wax, alongside vivid stone fruit and citrus flavours. The palate is graceful despite its underlying power and finishes extremely long.

Sparkling Wine

- 5 **Prosecco Extra Dry, Terra Serena 1881, Treviso, Italy** **125ml** £7.95 **Bottle** £38.00
Bright straw-yellow with greenish reflex. Lively perlage, and intense scents of white flowers and golden apple. Good intensity, fresh, elegant and soft at taste, pleasantly sugary.
- 6 **Trillian's Sparkling Shiraz, Paulett's, Polish Hill River, Clare Valley Australia NV** **125ml** £8.95 **Bottle** £48.00

The name Polish River comes from the Polish settlers who came to the area in the early **1850s** escaping religious persecution. Paulett's reputation for producing wines of finesse, elegance and intensity is justly deserved with consistent skill and care from vintage to vintage. This extraordinary speciality red sparkling wine is based on a cool climate Cabernet Shiraz blend from vines situated on the Trillian's Hills in Clare Valley. It is a deep ruby colour with a lively mousse, yet the savoury and plum aromas and subtle tannins give a lasting impression of elegance and well-balanced restraint.

The Wine List

Dry Whites – light, easy drinking

- 7 **Marsanne/Vermentino Joie de Vigne, Languedoc–Roussillon, France 2020** **£26.00**
Aromas of white fruits (peach, citrus, grapefruit) and a hint of peony lead to a crisp, fruity palate which is both easy to drink and refreshing.
- 8 **Tempranillo Blanco, Fincas de Azabache, Rioja, Spain 2020** **£34.00**
Tempranillo Blanco is a white Spanish wine grape variety which is grown in the Rioja DOC. It is a relatively `new` grape variety as it is a natural mutation of the red Tempranillo variety which is grown throughout Spain. The wine has fruity aromas with green apple, citrus and floral characters. Well-balanced with a refreshing acidity and a light, fruity finish with delicate floral notes lingering on the palate.
- 9 **Gavi di Gavi, ‘Rovereto’. Il Poggio, Italy 2020** **£42.00**
100% Cortese from a small, naturally-minded producer with an all-female team in the Rovereto hills. This is rich and rounded Gavi di Gavi, even when young due to undergoing malolactic fermentation. Articulated limestone and lemon notes backed with hints of sage and apple and a lovely crunchy acidity.
- 10 **Grüner Veltliner, Gruber Röschitz, Weinveiertel, Austria 2020** **£46.00**
An exciting family winery, run by 3 siblings. Fruit is sourced from their 4 different vineyards with differing soil types. Bursting with tangy, vibrant, unoaked, plump, green fruits with hints of white pepper and peach.
- 11 **Pinot Grigio ‘Fireman's Line’ Schiopetto, Friuli, Italy 2019** **£48.00**
Mario Schiopetto was regarded as the father of modern Italian white wine, his Friuli winery today making some of Italy’s finest. This floral, juicy Pinot Grigio from younger vines around 20-years-old is full of ripe pear, fennel, almond and mineral notes.
- 12 **Sancerre, Domaine La Barbotaine, Loire, France 2020** **125ml**  **£11.50** **£60.00**
Crisp, flavoursome Sancerre which offers elderflower and boxwood aromas. The palate shows juicy citrus fruit alongside the trademark elegance and minerality of the appellation.
- 13 **Chablis 1er Cru, Vaillons, Domaine Jean Dauvissat, France 2019** **125ml**  **£16.50** **£90.00**
Domaine Dauvissat have 3 parcels over 0.83ha in the 1er Cru appellation of Vaillons on the left bank of the river Le Serein. The soils here are rocky with fossils and shells, this forces the roots of the vines to dig deep which boosts the quality of the grapes. The wine has a great balance of power and finesse, combining an elegant and fresh acidity with mineral and smoky notes.



Off Dry Whites - aromatic, riper fruit, dry

- 14 **Viognier, Revelation, Badet Clément, Languedoc-Roussillon, France 2020** **£36.00**
Bursting with typical flavours of apricot and peach alongside elegant floral notes. The palate is round, with a refreshing acidity and a perfectly balanced finish.
- 15 **Château Montfollet Le Valentin, Bordeaux, France 2020** **£42.00**
60% Sauvignon, 20% Sauvignon Gris, 20% Sémillon, Aromas of ripe grapefruit and pineapple leap out of the glass accented by hints of vanilla. Ripe and juicy, packed with vibrant fruit, this dry white has an appealing, almost creamy texture before finishing fresh and dry.
- 16 **Sauvignon Blanc, Blackenbrook, Nelson, New Zealand 2021** **£45.00**
Highly aromatic and focused, vibrantly fruity with pure passionfruit and gooseberry flavours supported by an interwoven thread of acidity.
- 17 **Gewurztraminer, Terres de Gres, Robert Roth, Alsace, France 2019** **£50.00**
Fourth generation winemaker, young Victor Roth has recently taken over the winemaking and is a real talent to watch. This Gewurz has a hedonistic nose of lychee, spiced peach, ginger and charcuterie. A slightly earthy finish, medium-weight and versatile - not too sweet.
- 18 **Riesling Kabinett Annaberg, Werner, Mosel, Germany 2018** **£53.00**
The Werner winery is ranked amongst the oldest-established winegrowing estates near the Mosel river. A family property since 1650, it is run by husband-and-wife team, Bernhard and Margaret Werner, and has a select 6 hectares of steep slope vineyards, and produces some brilliant dry, off-dry and sweet Rieslings. This is a classic Mosel Riesling with a fresh lemony fragrance, complex minerality and stone fruits on the palate as acidity and sweetness exist in perfect harmony.
- 19 **Berthier Terre De Marne Côteaux Du Giennois Blanc, Loire Valley, Fr. 2020** **£58.00**
Côteaux du Giennois is a tiny 191-hectare region and only a recent appellation, despite archaeological evidence of winegrowing in the area from the 2nd century. These wines offer a more fruit-driven alternative to those from their famous neighbours of Sancerre and Pouilly. Ripe and round with textured notes of yellow plum and grapefruit followed by earthy minerality. An outstanding expression of Sauvignon Blanc.
- 20 **Dry Riesling, Sonberk Winery, Moravia, Czech Republic 2018** **£65.00**
A beautiful Riesling from the Czech Republic, aromas of white blossom and lime zest are abundant on the bouquet. The palate is zesty and fresh with notes of honeysuckle, dried apricots, a subtle spiciness and a flinty minerality which lingers on the palate. Elegant and refined with plenty of character and body.
- 21 **Pinot Gris, Elk Cove, Willamette Valley, Oregon USA 2017** **125ml**  **£13.25** **£70.00**
Elk Cove is one of Oregon's oldest and most respected wineries, famed for producing some of the top Pinot Gris in the region. Plump, soft, oily and dry. Ripe melon, spiced pear and apricot blossom notes.
- 22 **Givry Blanc, 'Cuvee Amelie', Domaine Besson, Burgundy, France 2019** **125ml**  **£14.00** **£76.00**
One of the very few white wines made in Givry. A pale lemon in colour with white peaches and floral nuances on the nose. The palate is round with notes of white blossom, candied lemon peel, peaches and a soft, creamy character. The rounded mouthfeel is nicely balanced by an elegant acidity and a long finish.



Full-bodied Whites – powerful, full of flavour and concentration

- 23 **Pinot Bianco, Le Monde, Friuli-Venezia Giulia, Italy 2017** **£42.00**
A pale gold in colour, this award-winning Friulian Pinot Bianco is a pure expression of the region. The nose is bursting full of tropical fruit aromas with ripe peach and some sweet spices. The palate is medium-bodied with a creamy texture and notes of ripe peaches and pears, together with an elegant, citrus acidity which leaves a clean impression on the finish.
- 24 **Soave, ‘Colli Scaligeri’ Sandro De Bruno, Veneto, Italy 2019** **£45.00**
A superb expression of the Garganega grape grown on volcanic soils using organic techniques. Nose of ripe melon, spiced apricot, almond and orange peel. A lovely textural element to the layered palate that finishes with a fresh, tangy mineral finish.
- 25 **Chenin Blanc, Sur Lie, Laibach Vineyards, Stellenbosch, South Africa 2020** **£48.00**
This wine is made from the oldest vineyard on the farm. No additives were used and fermentation in 50% in old barrels, 25% in concrete eggs and 25% in stainless steel. The resulting wine is a refreshing colour with an orangey tint. A very exotic nose with tropical, papaya and white peach in abundance. On the palate a lovely mineral character combines with the ripe tropical and stone fruits, very long with a fresh acidity.
- 26 **Godello, ‘San Salvador’, Abad, Bierzo, Spain 2018** **125ml**  **£12.95** **£65.00**
A superb winery from the region of Bierzo in Northwest Spain. The region enjoys a unique microclimate, resulting from the combination of both Atlantic and Mediterranean continental climate, while the steep slate-soiled hillsides are perfect for the production of high-quality grapes. A single-vineyard barrel-aged Godello from 80-year-old vines, this classy white displays creamy Burgundian characteristics, with hints of yellow peach skin, minerals and toasted nut.
- 27 **Chardonnay, ‘Ashley’s’, Fess Parker, California, USA 2017** **125ml**  **£14.95** **£78.00**
A superb single-vineyard wine, planted on hillside vineyards named after the daughter of former 1950’s Hollywood actor of Davey Crockett fame, Fess Parker. A true custodian of the Santa Barbara wine scene, whose name is now up in lights for Fess Parker’s stunning wines. This ex-Jurassic riverbed site is cooled by the Pacific Ocean breezes. Full of ripe peach, nougat, lemon curd and baking spice with a refreshing yet textured finish. Stunning.
- 28 **Chardonnay, ‘Bateleur’, De Wetshof Estate, Robertson, SA 2018** **125ml**  **£17.95** **£96.00**
This wine is made from a vineyard planted in 1987 from plant material Danie sourced in 1981 from the famous Clos des Mouches vineyard in Burgundy. This wine is a reflection of Danie de Wet’s personal taste combining great depth and length of flavour with elegance and finesse. An in-depth knowledge of his specific vineyard plots allows him, in conjunction with barrel selection, to craft one of the best Chardonnays made in South Africa. The full spectrum of Chardonnay flavours explode in the mouth, with tropical and stone fruits tempered with fresh, zingy lime acidity and a creamy textured finish.
- 29 **Chassagne Montrachet, Chateau Phillippe Le Hardi, Burgundy, France, 2018** **£120.00**
A Domaine steeped in history that has recently been restored to its best, with new owners instantly building a reputation for sustainably produced wine of the highest quality. Fermented in oak with 12 months’ lees ageing. Ripe, honeyed stone fruit with hints of grilled nuts, broad-textured with typical minerality rounding out this classy white.



Rosé/Orange/Chilled Red Wine

- 30 **Crazy Tropez Rose, Domaine Tropez, IGP Mediterranee, France 2020** **£32.00**
70% Grenache and 30% Cinsault. Pale pink colour with salmon highlights. the nose is fresh and aromatic, with notes of citrus and tropical fruit. Delicious and indulgently fruity on the palate with suggestions of spice and minerality. Zesty citrus notes and juicy acidity converge on a smooth finish.
- 31 **Piquepoul Rosé, Les Vignobles Foncalieu, Languedoc, France 2020** **£36.00**
Pale pink in colour, this Piquepoul rosé has a delicate nose of cherry blossom, strawberries and peaches. The palate is wonderfully fresh with summer berry flavours and notes of crushed rose petals. The fruity notes are balanced perfectly with a lively, citrus acidity leaving the palate refreshed.
- 32 **Little Ra Ra Red, Shiraz, Pyren Vineyards, Victoria, Australia 2019** **£52.00**
The Little Ra Ra rouge is an early picked Shiraz with just 2 hours' skin contact which is then pressed. This is blended with a second parcel of extended maceration, whole bunch Shiraz plus a little Sauvignon Blanc. The resulting wine is a pale ruby colour with notes of cranberries on the nose. The palate is fresh with a crisp acidity and notes of red cherries, raspberries and rosehips. Bottled unrefined and unfiltered.
- 33 **Kisi, Dugladze, Kakheti, Georgia 2017** **£55.00**
Georgia, lying on the crossroads of Europe and Asia is sometimes referred to as "The Cradle of Wine" due to its 8000-year-old winemaking history. Perfumed with aromas of dried mango, honeydew melon and orange rind, this has a full-bodied yet silky and elegant palate finishing dry with supple elegant tannins.
- 34 **Cabernet Franc/Syrah, Sunset Rosé, Chateau Ksara, Lebanon 2019** **£56.00**
Chateau Ksara is Lebanon's largest and oldest commercial winery, established by Jesuit monks in 1857. Their Sunset Rosé is a crisp wine that works perfectly as an aperitif or with Mediterranean cuisine. Deeply coloured with gorgeous aromas of strawberries and spice, this is juicy and lively on the palate with summer berries and cream.

Sake

- 35 **Wasabi Leaf & Apple Sparkling Sake (330ml)** **£ 8.50**
Junmai Sake infused with Dorset wasabi and Herefordshire cider apple. Medium-dry, honeyed tangy apple, with a hint of herb and umami.
- 36 **Kumo Tokubetsu Junmai Nigori** 100ml Glass **£10.95** 375ml Bottle: **£45.00**
70% milled super-premium Japanese Gohyakumangoku rice. This deliberately contains rice sediment, so we shake before using. Delicious, off-dry with a soft round texture and great depth of flavour including complex tropical fruit and banana notes.
- 37 **Asahara Shuzo Nigori Yuzushu Liqueur** 100ml Glass **£12.95** 500ml Bottle: **£55.00**
The Yuzu fruits are macerated in sugar-cane based neutral alcohol for several weeks. At the end of the process, macerated fruits are crushed mashed and re-incorporated to the final product, together with sugar syrup, and more fresh crushed fruits. This is bottled unfiltered to retain maximum purity.



Light-bodied Reds – fruity, softer tannins

- 38 **Grenache/Pinot Noir, Joie de Vigne, Languedoc-Roussillon, France 2020** **£26.00**
Inviting aromas of red fruits are lifted by pepper and cinnamon. The palate is smooth and spicy, finishing on more berry fruit.
- 39 **Cannonau di Sardegna, 'Tiscali', Puddu, Sardinia, Italy 2019** **£38.00**
The Fratelli Puddu winery is located in the centre-east of Sardinia at the foot of the ancient limestone Mount Corراسi in the Supramonte mountain range. This is a rugged and wild area which is one of Sardinia's richest in local fauna and flora, covered in around 650 species of herbs, flowers and trees. The decomposed granite and limestone soils and Mediterranean sun allied to altitude, and the cooling sea breezes give the grapes concentrated flavours but with freshness and balance. A delicate, pale, lightly unoaked red made from a derivative of Grenache. Enticing notes of wild red berries and rosehip.
- 40 **Pinot Nero, Sandro de Bruno Rosso Fumo, Veneto, Italy 2017** **£48.00**
Ruby red, bright and consistent. On the nose a beautiful bouquet of fresh red fruit; raspberry, wild strawberry, marasca cherry, and cranberry; then floral of rosehip and violet. Spicy hints of black pepper in large grains and cloves. Delicate tannins with juicy softness, savoury and bitter notes.
- 41 **Etna Rosso, Sentieri Siciliani, Sicily, Italy 2019** **£56.00**
Volcanic soils and a maritime influence combine to impart a distinct elegance and mineral character upon the island's wines. This Etna Rosso is made with the native grapes Nerello Mascalese and Nerello Cappuccio, grown at an altitude of 650-750m above sea level on the slopes of Mt. Etna. The soil of Mt. Etna is volcanic and very rich in minerals which give the wine a rustic smoky, earthy note. The palate has elegant redcurrant flavours combined with spices, liquorice and a balsamic note on the finish.
- 42 **Tinto Vulcânico, The Azores Wine Co, Açores, Portugal 2019** 125ml  **£13.25** **£70.00**
The windswept archipelago of the Azores in the mid-Atlantic is one of the world's most unique wine regions, recognised by Unesco. A delicious blend of around a dozen local and international grape varieties, grown in unique, walled, volcanic vineyards in the mid-Atlantic. Enticing and exotic on the nose with rosehip, rhubarb, raspberry and iodine. A definitive salty, mineral character finishes on the vibrant palate.
- 43 **Pinot Noir, Fess Parker, Santa Rita Hills, California, USA 2019** 125ml  **£17.95** **£85.00**
Founded in 1989, the Fess Parker winery is located in Santa Barbara County, the Californian wine region made famous by the cult movie Sideways. Santa Rita Hills is arguably the most exciting wine region in the world for making cool climate Pinot Noir just inland from the Pacific Ocean. Full of raspberry liqueur, stewed plum, cinnamon and dark spices
- 44 **Chassagne Montrachet Rouge, Les Chaumes, Domaine Morey-Coffinet, Burgundy France 2015** **£120.00**
A brilliant ruby-red moving to magenta at the rim, with an extremely inviting nose loaded with fresh, ripe notes of red and black cherry, wild strawberry, and cranberry mixed with wet rose petals and forest floor/underbrushy quality. The minerality and tannin is subtle and fine-grained, and the fruit generous.



Medium-bodied Reds

- 45 **Bellafiore, Tenuta Fiorebelli, Veneto, Italy 2019** **£35.00**
Bella Fiore meaning 'beautiful flower' is made with dried grapes, 60% Corvina, 30% Rondinella, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon. Made in a similar way to Valpolicella Amarone where the grapes are dried before fermenting, concentrating the sugars and flavours. This results in a rich red with lots of sweet ripe cherry fruits and a velvety, mouth-filling texture.
- 46 **Celler Masroig Rojalet Seleccio, Montsant, Spain 2018** **£40.00**
70% Carignan, 30% Grenache with perfumed aromas of mulberry, blueberry and a hint of well-handled vanilla and coffee oak. Soft, supple and approachable, delivering delicious, lush early-drinking pleasure.
- 47 **Cabernet Sauvignon, Powers, Washington State, United States 2018** **£46.00**
Cabernet Sauvignon from 4 sites in the Columbia Valley ranging from medium cool to very warm, Merlot and Carmenere contribute to the balance and complexity of this wine. Savoury notes of fennel and sage are backed by deep aromas of blackberry, black raspberry and cassia, with notes of wet limestone and gravel.
- 48 **Pisano Rio de Los Pajaros, Progreso, Uruguay 2019** **£50.00**
A clever blend of 3 varieties; 55% Tannat, 40%, Syrah, 5% Viognier. The result is a dark and intense purple colour. An aroma of prunes and a touch of liquorice, followed by spices of cinnamon and black pepper. On the palate, leather notes, blueberries and dark cherries are prominent, with well-integrated toasty oak.
- 49 **Merlot, Montagne St Emilion, Château Montaguillon, Bordeaux, France 2018** **£52.00**
An expressive nose of roasted plums, dried herbs and fresh earthy notes leads to a full, plush palate typical of this very successful vintage.
- 50 **'The Navigator' Strandveld, Cape Agulhas, South Africa 2018** **£58.00**
55% Shiraz, 26% Grenache, 9% Mourvèdre, 7% Viognier. A Rhone blend that delivers exquisite, cool-climate notes of clove and white pepper. Blackberry, dried peach, intense fruit and spice are well-cradled on the mid-palate with soft, round tannins on the finish.
- 51 **Nero d'Avola, 'Halcyon Days', Unico Zelo, Barmera, Riverland, Australia 2020** **£65.00**
If you love Pinot Noir but want to try something different, then this is for you. A great medium-bodied red wine. Fresh acidity, plush red fruits and a whisper of spice.
- 52 **Grenache 'Old Vine' Head Wines, Barossa, Australia, 2019** **125ml**  **£13.25** **£70.00**
From 130–160-year-old vines, whole bunch natural fermentation, hand-plunged and foot-trodden. A gorgeously perfumed red with raspberry and red cherry notes and a background of gentle sweet spice. Only 300 cases produced.
- 53 **Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Domaine du Grand Tinel, Rhone, France 2017** **£90.00**
This famous wine is produced from 50-year-old vines grown on the pebble-strewn slopes surrounding the village of Chateau Neuf du Pape, an area with a rich and long history of vine cultivation back to 1308. After 24 months' maturation in oak barrel, the richness and power is softened with complex aromas of wild herbs, cedar and pepper. It has ample flavours of cherry, strawberry and prune held by a strong, spicy character.

- 54 **Vega Tinto, DFJ Vinhos, Douro Valley, Portugal 2019** £35.00
Vega emanates from the steep terraced vineyards of the Douro Valley and is a sturdy table wine blended from 3 of the region's best varieties, Touriga Nacional, Touriga Franca and Tinta Roriz. It is rich and full-bodied but very smooth in the mouth with plum, cherry and mineral elements and complex with a firm grip of tannins.
- 55 **'Friends Red' Pedroncelli, Sonoma County, California, USA 2016** £38.00
73% Merlot, 12% Syrah, 8% Zinfandel, 7% Sangiovese. Cassis and plum on the nose, vanilla and mocha aromas developing. Velvety palate, with soft tannins and great balance.
- 56 **Shiraz, Woodstock 'Deep Sands', McLaren Vale, Australia 2017** £47.00
A superbly rich, multi-layered expression of Shiraz from its South Australian heartland. Full of dark sweet forest fruits with hints of Christmas spice and seaweed on a lingering palate.
- 57 **Sangiovese, Chianti Classico, Pèppoli, Villa Antinori, Toscana, Italy 2019** £52.00
Intense red fruit aromas are offset by delicate notes of vanilla and chocolate. Pleasantly lingering with a fresh, vibrant feel in the mouth.
- 58 **Barrel Fermented Malbec, Saurus, Fam Schroeder, Patagonia, Argentina 2019** £58.00
A deep ruby red colour with a hint of violet. The combination of individually selected blocks of intense Malbec fermented in subtly toasted new oak barrels gives full ripened fruit aromas with strong plum and cassis gently backed with floral and spiced nuances. This is a firm, well-structured wine with hints of vanilla and chocolate, a soft and full mouth feel with a long lingering finish.
- 59 **Barbaresco, Bosio "Boschi dei Signori", Piedmont, Italy, 2018** 125ml  £12.25 £62.00
A beautifully pure and ripe Nebbiolo. Showing raspberry and damson notes accented with hints of rose petal, fresh leather and dusty tannins.
- 60 **Pantocrator 'Editon Limitada' Rioja, Bodegas Taron, Spain 2010** 125ml  £14.95 £80.00
Only made in the very best vintages, Pantocrator is a blend of Tempranillo and Mazuelo, hand-picked from bush vines over 70 years old. The 2 varieties are aged separately in American oak barrels for 12 months and then blended and returned to the barrels for another 6 months. The wine is left in stainless steel tanks for 12 months where it is further refined and only then is it deemed ready for bottling.
- 61 **Château Batailley, Pauillac, Bordeaux, France 2015** 125ml  £17.50 £95.00
One of the oldest estates in Medoc, this is drinking superbly. A very typical Pauillac, showing firm cassis and cigar-box aromas, medium weight with a degree of power in the mouth, and a long, savoury finish.
- 62 **Brunello di Montalcino Riserva, Val di Suga, Tuscany, Italy, 2015** 125ml  £18.25 £98.00
This Brunello Riserva is made from some of the oldest vines grown across the estate's 3 main vineyards. Aged Sangiovese, with complex damson, balsamic and charcuterie aromas, full yet refined and utterly seductive.
- 63 **Barolo Riserva. Paolo Manzone, Piedmont, Italy, 2013** £125.00
A powerful old vine expression from a top Barolo vintage, really starting to come into its own. Compelling aromas of cherries, spices and hints of roasted meats.

A stunning mixture of concentration and freshness, tingling with orangey acidity and floral, grapey aromas, then direct, powerful and surprisingly sweet on the palate.

Glass: 125ml **£10.50**
A late-picked fortified wine that has aged in barrel for years before release, building sweet, nutty, raisined complexity along the way. Drink with blue cheese, chocolate or caramel desserts.

Glass: 125ml **£12.00**
A sweet, late-harvest blend of 50% Furmint, 40% Muskotály, 10% Hárslevelu. Floral notes of lychee and baked peach and an elegant refreshing sweetness which never overpowers.

The classic French dessert wine, a blend of late harvest botrytised Sauvignon and Semillon packed with ripe, honeyed tropical fruits overlaid with vanilla and hints of butterscotch.

Heiderer-Mayer is a family run winery, established in 1844. Beerenauslese is a term for a late harvest wine where the grapes had botrytis. The result is a golden yellow dessert wine with rich notes of orange peel and ripe apricots. The natural sweetness is balanced by a fresh acidity.
- 69 **Rasteau Vin Doux Naturel Domaine De Beaurenard, France 2015** Bottle: 500ml **£55.00**

The grapes for this sweet, fortified Rasteau grow on especially well-exposed terraces of stony, clay-chalk soil. They are entirely Grenache Noir, in small, highly concentrated bunches. The juice then continues to macerate for a few days to fix the wine's magnificent purple colour and tannins. Two years' ageing in oak casks gives full expression to this sweet wine.

Trebbiano, Malvasia & Grechetto, These grapes are harvested in late September, then dried on racks until March of the following year. After a gentle pressing, the wine is aged for 20 years in small casks. This wine is only made in tiny quantities and displays walnut and raisin aromas alongside toffee and marmalade notes, accented with hints of cinnamon and coffee which evolves in the glass. A special, unique wine.
