



The Drappier family has been producing Champagne since **1808**. This historic and pioneering house was instrumental in reintroducing Pinot Noir to the Aube post phylloxera, and it continues to work at the cutting edge of Champagne production. Provenance, excellence and distinctive style are the mantras, both in the vineyard, which are increasingly farmed according to organic principles, and in the cellar, where minimal use of sulphur is the rule and the wines remain unfiltered. In **2016**, Drappier became the first 'carbon neutral' Champagne house.

- 1 Champagne Drappier 1er Cru NV Brut** **125ml £14.50** **Bottle £78.00**

60% Pinot Noir, 30% Chardonnay, 10% Pinot Meunier

The grapes come only from Grand Cru and Premier Cru vineyards. Very low in sulphur. Elegant and fresh on the nose. Firm and intense, with pear, spices, vanilla and a hint of acacia honey. Toasty bread, long on the palate with a light hazelnut aftertaste.

- 2 Champagne Drappier Brut Rosé NV** **125ml £15.50** **Bottle £85.00**

100% Pinot Noir

A unique Champagne Rosé made using the saignée method and with very low sulphur. Well structured, with exemplary purity of red fruits. Warm and satiny, lightly spiced with balanced hints of stoned fruits thanks to a lovely freshness in the finish.

100% Pinot Noir

A thrilling champagne of real depth and energy, this sugar-free, sulphur-free Blanc de Noirs offers a rich nose of apple, pear and hazelnut, followed by a bone-dry palate full of refined lemon and mineral flavour.

92% Pinot Noir, 8% Chardonnay

Impressively rich and savoury, Drappier's flagship wine shows complex, mature notes of dried fruit, toast and wax, vivid stone fruit and citrus flavours. The palate is graceful despite its underlying power and finishes extremely long.

1	Marsanne/Vermentino Joie de Vigne, Languedoc-Roussillon, France 2020	£26.00
Aromas of white fruits, peach, citrus, grapefruit and a hint of peony lead to a crisp, fruity palate which is both easy to drink and refreshing.		
2	Tempranillo Blanco, Fincas de Azabache, Rioja, Spain 2020	£34.00
<i>It is a relatively 'new' grape variety as it is a natural mutation of the red Tempranillo variety which is grown throughout Spain. The wine has fruity aromas with green apple, citrus and floral characters. Well-balanced with a refreshing acidity and a light, fruity finish with delicate floral notes lingering on the palate.</i>		
3	Azal Vinho Verde, AB Valley Wines, Minho, Portugal 2020	£38.00
<i>A light and zesty white from northwest Portugal. A delicate floral and citrus notes on the nose and the palate is very fresh with a zingy acidity and notes of green apple, white peach, grapefruit and a hint of elderflower.</i>		
4	Grüner Veltliner, Gruber Röschitz, Weinviertel, Austria 2020	£45.00
<i>An exciting family winery, run by 3 siblings. Fruit is sourced from their 4 different vineyards with differing soil types. Bursting with tangy, vibrant, unoaked, plump, green fruits with hints of white pepper and peach.</i>		
5	Gavi di Gavi, 'Rovereto'. Il Poggio, Italy 2020	£48.00
<i>100% Cortese from a small, naturally minded producer with an all-female team in the Rovereto hills. This is rich and rounded Gavi di Gavi, even when young due to undergoing malolactic fermentation. Articulated limestone and lemon notes backed with hints of sage and apple and a lovely crunchy acidity.</i>		
6	Sauvignon Blanc, Berthier Terre De Marne, Côteaux Du Giennois, Loire Valley, France 2020	£52.00
<i>Côteaux du Giennois is a tiny 191-hectare region and only a recent appellation, despite archaeological evidence of winegrowing in the area from the 2nd century. These wines offer a more fruit-driven alternative to those from their famous neighbours of Sancerre and Pouilly. Ripe and round with textured notes of yellow plum and grapefruit followed by earthy minerality. An outstanding expression of Sauvignon Blanc.</i>		
7	Koshu Hikari, Lumière, Yamanashi, Japan 2018	£56.00
<i>Koshu is the traditional grape variety indigenous to Japan which has been grown for hundreds of years in the Yamanashi prefecture. This fruity, dry wine was fermented in stainless steel tanks and aged on the lees for 6 months. A light bodied white wine with pure and fresh flavours of peach and citrus.</i>		
8	Sancerre, Domaine La Barbotaine, Loire, France 2020	125ml £11.95 £62.00
<i>Crisp, flavoursome Sancerre which offers elderflower and boxwood aromas. The palate shows juicy citrus fruit alongside the trademark elegance and minerality of the appellation.</i>		
9	Verdelho o Original, Azores Wine Co, Azores, Portugal 2018	125ml £14.95 £80.00
<i>An intensely mineral dry white wine, from the traditional Verdelho grape grown on extraordinary, windswept, coastal, volcanic vineyards in the Azores. Aromas of lime zest and muted pineapple with hints of ripe apple and orange blossom all playing second fiddle to wet stone, salt and mineral notes. Great depth and length; powerful yet restrained and tightly wound. A brilliant white.</i>		

Off Dry Whites - aromatic, riper fruit, dry

10	Viognier, Revelation, Badet Clément, Languedoc-Roussillon, France 2020	£36.00
<i>Bursting with typical flavours of apricot and peach alongside elegant floral notes. The palate is round, with a refreshing acidity and a perfectly balanced finish.</i>		
11	Dry Riesling, Weingut Fusser, Palatinate, Germany 2020	£43.00
<i>Brothers Georg and Martin Fusser have made wines in Niederkirchen near Deidesheim, Palatinate since 2006 and already since their first vintage in 2007 they have won several awards. The grapes for this Riesling have been handpicked and spontaneously fermented to give them great complexity & depth. The wine is young, slender and lively, characterized by citrus, apple and a little tropical fruit, good length.</i>		
12	Gewurztraminer, Terres de Gres, Robert Roth, Alsace, France 2019	£46.00
<i>Fourth generation winemaker, young Victor Roth has recently taken over the winemaking and is a real talent to watch. This Gewurz has a hedonistic nose of lychee, spiced peach, ginger and charcuterie. A slightly earthy finish, medium-weight and versatile – not too sweet.</i>		
13	Kabinett Riesling, Werner, Mosel, Germany 2018	£48.00
<i>The Werner winery is ranked amongst the oldest-established winegrowing estates near the Mosel river. This is a classic Mosel Riesling with a fresh lemony fragrance, complex minerality and stone fruits on the palate as acidity and sweetness exist in perfect harmony.</i>		
14	Dry Riesling, Elk Cove, Willamette Valley, Oregon, USA 2017	£60.00
<i>Positively jumps out of the glass with bursts of honeysuckle, honey and eucalyptus. A woodsy tone of cherry blossoms in springtime tempers the sweetness. Very rich and concentrated on the palate with bright, bright fruit accents of plum, fresh green apple and caramelised orange peel. Lively long, citrusy finish.</i>		
15	Palava, Sonberk Winery, Moravia, Czech Republic 2020	125ml £12.25 £68.00
<i>Palava is a crossing of Muller-Thurgau and Roter Traminer which was created in the Czech region of Moravia in the 1950s. This wine is a pale lemon colour with peaches and flowers on the nose. The palate is medium bodied with a pronounced floral character and notes of apple, apricot and honeysuckle.</i>		
16	Givry Blanc, 'Cuvee Amelie', Dom Besson, Burgundy, France 2019	£76.00
<i>One of the very few white wines made in Givry. A pale lemon in colour with white peaches and floral nuances on the nose. The palate is round with notes of white blossom, candied lemon peel, peaches and a soft, creamy character. The rounded mouthfeel is nicely balanced by an elegant acidity and a long finish.</i>		
17	Chablis 1er Cru, Vaillons, Dom Jean Dauvissat, France 2019	125ml £16.50 £90.00
<i>Domaine Dauvissat have 3 parcels over 0.83ha in the 1er Cru appellation of Vaillons on the left bank of the river Le Serein. The soils here are rocky with fossils and shells, this forces the roots of the vines to dig deep which boosts the quality of the grapes. The wine has a great balance of power and finesse, combining an elegant and fresh acidity with mineral and smoky notes.</i>		

Full-bodied Whites – powerful, full of flavour and concentration

18	Pinot Bianco, Le Monde, Friuli-Venezia Giulia, Italy 2017	£36.00
	A pale gold in colour, this award-winning Friulian Pinot Bianco is a pure expression of the region.	
	The nose is bursting full of tropical fruit aromas with ripe peach and some sweet spices. The palate is medium-bodied with a creamy texture and notes of ripe peaches and pears, together with an elegant, citrus acidity which leaves a clean impression on the finish.	
19	Soave, ‘Colli Scaligeri’ Sandro De Bruno, Veneto, Italy 2019	£45.00
	A superb expression of the Garganega grape grown on volcanic soils using organic techniques. Nose of ripe melon, spiced apricot, almond and orange peel. A lovely textural element to the layered palate that finishes with a fresh, tangy mineral finish.	
20	Chenin Blanc, Sur Lie, Laibach Vineyards, Stellenbosch, South Africa 2020	£49.00
	This wine is made from the oldest vineyard on the farm. No additives were used and fermentation in 50% in old barrels, 25% in concrete eggs and 25% in stainless steel. The resulting wine is a refreshing colour with an orangey tint. A very exotic nose with tropical, papaya and white peach in abundance. On the palate a lovely mineral character combines with the ripe tropical and stone fruits, very long with a fresh acidity.	
21	Godello, ‘San Salvador’, Abad, Bierzo, Spain 2018	£65.00
	A superb winery from the region of Bierzo in Northwest Spain. A single-vineyard barrel-aged Godello from 80-year-old vines, this classy white displays creamy Burgundian characteristics, with hints of yellow peach skin, minerals and toasted nut.	
22	Chardonnay, ‘Ashley’s’, Fess Parker, California, USA 2017	125ml  £13.95 £75.00
	A superb single-vineyard wine, planted on hillside vineyards named after the daughter of former 1950's Hollywood actor of Davy Crocket fame, Fess Parker. This ex-Jurassic riverbed site is cooled by the Pacific Ocean breezes. Full of ripe peach, nougat, lemon curd and baking spice with a refreshing yet textured finish.	
23	Condrieu Les Terrasses, Roland Grangier, Rhône, France 2017	125ml  £15.50 £82.00
	100% Viognier barrel-fermented in 30% new oak. This 2017 Condrieu les Terrasses is a honeyed, plush wine for immediate consumption. Apricot and melon flavours wash easily over the medium to full-bodied palate, easing into a long, zesty-spicy finish.	
24	Chardonnay, ‘Bateleur’, De Wetshof Estate, Robertson, South Africa 2018	125ml  £17.50 £90.00
	This wine is made from plant material sourced in 1981 from the famous Clos des Mouches vineyard in Burgundy. This wine has great depth and length of flavour with elegance and finesse. A full spectrum of Chardonnay flavours explode in the mouth, with tropical and stone fruits tempered with fresh, zingy lime acidity and a creamy textured finish.	
25	Chassagne Montrachet Blanc Les Houilleres Morey-Coffinet Burgundy, France, 2019	£120.00
	The tiny vineyard of ‘La Romanee’ rests on the higher slopes south of the hamlet of Chassagne. Its wines come across as quite rich and powerful, pale gold in colour, with gorgeous buttery, nutty notes on the nose and restrained oak spice. This wine is exceptionally complex and well balanced with a vein of acidity that contributes elegance and poise on a long finish.	

Rosé & Orange Wine

26	Crazy Tropez Rose, Domaine Tropez, IGP Mediterranee, France 2020	£36.00
<i>70% Grenache and 30% Cinsault. Pale pink colour with salmon highlights. the nose is fresh and aromatic, with notes of citrus and tropical fruit. Delicious and indulgently fruity on the palate with suggestions of spice and minerality. Zesty citrus notes and juicy acidity converge on a smooth finish.</i>		
27	Piquepoul Rosé, Les Vignobles Foncalieu, Languedoc, France 2020	£42.00
<i>Pale pink in colour, this Piquepoul rosé has a delicate nose of cherry blossom, strawberries and peaches. The palate is wonderfully fresh with summer berry flavours and notes of crushed rose petals. The fruity notes are balanced perfectly with a lively, citrus acidity leaving the palate refreshed.</i>		
28	Kisi Orange, Dugladze, Kakheti, Georgia 2017	£55.00
<i>Georgia, lying on the crossroads of Europe and Asia is sometimes referred to as “The Cradle of Wine” due to its 8000-year-old winemaking history. Perfumed with aromas of dried mango, honeydew melon and orange rind, this has a full-bodied yet silky and elegant palate finishing dry with supple elegant tannins.</i>		
29	Albariño Sitta Maceracion Orange, Attis, Galicia, Spain 2020	£60.00
<i>Juice from the Albarino is left in contact with the skins for 15 days. The result is an amber colour wine with notes of marmalade and nectarine. The palate is rich with very complex notes of stone fruits, orange peel, ginger and spice, complemented by a fresh acidity that keeps everything in perfect balance.</i>

30	Wasabi Leaf & Apple Sparkling Sake (330ml)	£ 8.50
<i>Junmai Sake infused with Dorset wasabi and Herefordshire cider apple. Medium-dry, honeyed tangy apple, with a hint of herb and umami.</i>		
31	Kumo Tokubetsu Junmai Nigori	100ml Glass £10.95 375ml Bottle: £45.00
<i>70% milled super-premium Japanese Gohyakumangoku rice. This deliberately contains rice sediment, so we shake before using. Delicious, off-dry with a soft round texture and great depth of flavour including complex tropical fruit and banana notes.</i>		
32	Asahara Shuzo Nigori Yuzushu Liqueur	100ml Glass £12.95 500ml Bottle: £55.00
<i>The Yuzu fruits are macerated in sugarcane based neutral alcohol for several weeks. At the end of the process, macerated fruits are crushed mashed and re-incorporated to the final product, together with sugar syrup, and more fresh crushed fruits. This is bottled unfiltered to retain maximum purity.</i>		

Light-bodied Reds – fruity, softer tannins

33	Grenache/Pinot Noir, Joie de Vigne, Languedoc-Roussillon, France 2020	£26.00
<i>Inviting aromas of red fruits are lifted by pepper and cinnamon. The palate is smooth and spicy, finishing on more berry fruit.</i>		
34	Pinot Noir L'Instant, Berthier, Loire Valley, France 2020	£38.00
<i>This region is known for its white wine production but as the climate changes it has displayed its capacity for outstanding Pinot Noir. The vines grow on clay-limestone soil, mainly in the Northern sector of Sancerre. A Pinot Noir packed with juicy wild mulberries and cherry with a fresh, vibrant soft palate.</i>		
35	Cannonau di Sardegna, ‘Tiscali’, Puddu, Sardinia, Italy 2019	£46.00
<i>The Fratelli Puddu winery is located in the centre-east of Sardinia at the foot of the ancient limestone Mount Corraso in the Supramonte mountain range. The decomposed granite and limestone soils and Mediterranean sun allied to altitude, and the cooling sea breezes give the grapes concentrated flavours but with freshness and balance. A delicate, pale, lightly unoaked red made from a derivative of Grenache. Enticing notes of wild red berries and rosehip.</i>		
36	Carignan ‘Old Vine’ Chateau Ksara, Bekka Valley, Lebanon 2018	£52.00
<i>From 60-year-old, low-yielding vines. An intense expression of Carignan, combining ripe red and black fruits, wild herbs and black pepper spice. The tannins are bold but refined and a streak of acidity lifts and lengthens the finish. Delicious when chilled.</i>		
37	Etna Rosso, Sentieri Siciliani, Sicily, Italy 2019	£56.00
<i>Volcanic soils and a maritime influence combine to impart a distinct elegance and mineral character upon the island’s wines. This Etna Rosso is made with the native grapes Nerello Mascalese and Nerello Cappuccio, grown at an altitude of 650-750m above sea level on the slopes of Mt. Etna. The soil of Mt. Etna is volcanic and very rich in minerals which give the wine a rustic smoky, earthy note. The palate has elegant redcurrant flavours combined with spices, liquorice and a balsamic note on the finish.</i>		
38	Tinto Vulcânico, The Azores Wine Co, Açores, Portugal 2019	125ml ✓ £13.95 £70.00
<i>The windswept archipelago of the Azores in the mid-Atlantic is one of the world’s most unique wine regions, recognised by Unesco. A delicious blend of around a dozen local and international grape varieties, grown in unique, walled, volcanic vineyards in the mid-Atlantic. Enticing and exotic on the nose with rosehip, rhubarb, raspberry and iodine. A definitive salty, mineral character finishes on the vibrant palate.</i>		
39	Pinot Noir, Fess Parker, Santa Rita Hills, California, USA 2019	125ml ✓ £15.50 £80.00
<i>Founded in 1989, the Fess Parker winery is located in Santa Barbara County, the Californian wine region made famous by the cult movie Sideways. Santa Rita Hills is arguably the most exciting wine region in the world for making cool climate Pinot Noir just inland from the Pacific Ocean. Full of raspberry liqueur, stewed plum, cinnamon and dark spices</i>		
40	Chassagne Montrachet Rouge, Les Chaumes, Domaine Morey-Coffinet, Burgundy France 2015	£110.00
<i>A brilliant ruby-red moving to magenta at the rim, with an extremely inviting nose loaded with fresh, ripe notes of red and black cherry, wild strawberry, and cranberry mixed with wet rose petals and forest floor/under brushy quality. The minerality and tannin is subtle and fine-grained, and the fruit generous.</i>

	<i>70% Carignan, 30% Grenache with perfumed aromas of mulberry, blueberry and a hint of well-handled vanilla and coffee oak. Soft, supple and approachable, delivering delicious, lush early-drinking pleasure.</i>	
42	Cabernet Sauvignon, Powers, Washington State, United States 2018	£45.00
	<i>From the cool climate of Columbia Valley. Savoury notes of fennel and sage are backed by deep aromas of blackberry, black raspberry and cassis, with notes of wet limestone and gravel.</i>	
43	Château Gachon Montagne St Emilion, Bordeaux, France 2016	£55.00
	<i>A blend of Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon; this wine is a deep ruby colour with purple hues and has a soft nose of cherry, cassis, and spice. Well balanced with a solid tannic structure and a soft mid-palate of ripe plums and red berries, well-integrated oak ageing added structure and spice.</i>

	<i>55% Shiraz, 26% Grenache, 9% Mourvèdre, 7% Viognier. A Rhone blend that delivers exquisite, cool-climate notes of clove and white pepper. Blackberry, dried peach, intense fruit and spice are well-cradled on the mid-palate with soft, round tannins on the finish.</i>	
45	Barbaresco, Bosio "Boschi dei Signori", Piedmont, Italy, 2018	£62.00
	<i>Cantine Bosio was founded in 1967 by Angela and Egidio who produced their first wine from vineyards nestled amongst the hills of Langhe. This is a beautifully pure and ripe Nebbiolo. Showing raspberry and damson notes accented with hints of rose petal, fresh leather and dusty tannins.</i>	
46	Nero d'Avola, 'Halcyon Days', Unico Zelo, Barmera, Riverland, Australia 2020	£65.00
	<i>If you love Pinot Noir but want to try something a bit different with a touch more body and fruit then this is for you. A great medium bodied red wine: fresh acidity, plush red fruits, a whisper of spice.</i>	
47	Grenache 'Old Vine' Head Wines, Barossa, Australia, 2019	£70.00
	<i>From 130–160-year-old vines, whole bunch natural fermentation, hand-plunged and foot-trodden. A gorgeously perfumed red with raspberry and red cherry notes and a background of gentle sweet spice. Only 300 cases produced.</i>	
48	Barbera d'Alba 'Zio Nando' Single Vineyard, Rivetto, Piedmont, Italy 2019	125ml £14.95 £78.00
